Programs

Foster Care Program

When a child is removed from an unsafe environment, WVCCC is there to provide a safe, stable and loving home for the child to grow and thrive. WVCCC recruits, trains, licenses and/or certifies, culturally and ethnically diverse foster or adoptive families. WVCCC also provides ongoing supportive service to ensure continued success of each child and family.

Kinship Care Program

Relatives are the preferred resource for children who are removed from their birthparents because it helps the children stay connected with their families. WVCCC can assist and support these relatives through the kinship process.

Adoption Program

WVCCC is licensed to provide private, step-parent and state adoptions in the state of Arizona. The goal of this program is to protect the best interest of the child while building loving families. Adoptive homes are selected based on the needs of the child. Therefore, individuals or families are chosen to meet the safety, social, emotional, physical and mental health needs of the children placed in their care.

Training Program

In order to become a foster, kinship or adoptive parent, the state requires that you complete Parenting for Safety and Permanency Model Approach to Partnerships in Parenting (PS-MAPP) classes prior to being licensed or certified. Once licensed or certified, foster and adoptive parents must complete six hours of Advanced Training Educational Workshops to remain in licensing compliance. WVCCC is a state contracted provider agency that delivers these required trainings.

Family Visitation Program

Staying true to our core values and the service philosophy of family centered care, WVCCC implemented the Family Visitation Program in November 2014. The program, delivered in partnership with Arizona Department of Child Safety, focuses on family reunification services. Visitation can help implement many essential family reunification goals, including maintaining the parent/child/sibling relationships; enhancing child and parent self-images; promoting partnership between parents and foster parents; learning and practicing parenting skills; helping family members confront reality; and documenting progress towards reunification goals.

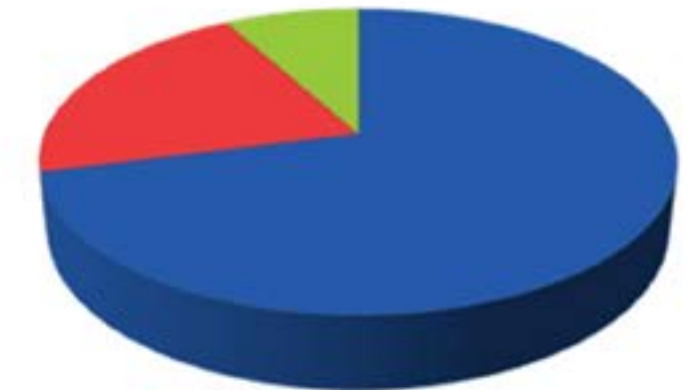
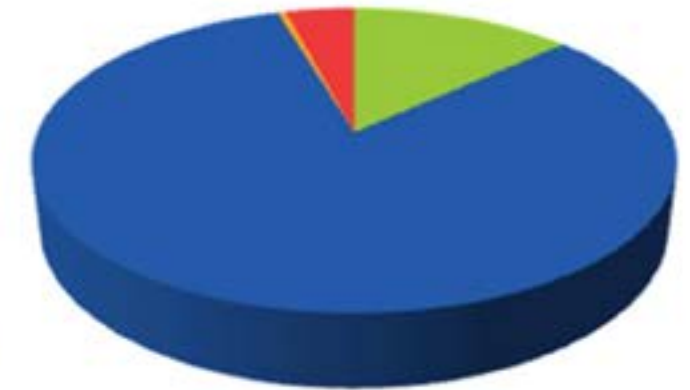
